- You will not win using a simple system.




Why Tournaments are So Profitable



Tournament Structure



Typical Tournament Structure


- Roughly 1 in 7 players get in the money.
- Everyone else loses their buy-in.
- You get at least 1.5x your buy-in back when you get in the money (ITM).
- In a 500 person \$100 buy-in tournament, 75th place may pay \$150 whereas 1st place may pay \$10,000.
- While cashing is relevant, winning is most important.

There is a Lot of Variance in Tournaments


- Variance is wild!
- If you are an average player, if you play 1,000 person tournaments, you will make the final table 1 in 100 times you play





10 Samples

- 10 100-game samples in 1,000 person tournaments with a 50% return on investment (ROI).
- ROI = (Amount Cashed Amount Invested)/Amount Invested
- Suppose you play 100 \$110 buy-in tournaments and cash for \$20,000.
- ROI = (\$20,000 \$11,000)/\$11,000 = .81 = 81% ROI





Big Blind Ante

- Most tournaments now feature a big blind ante.
- The big blind puts an amount of money into the pot equal to the big blind that is "dead".
- This masterclass assumes there is a big blind ante in play.



Equity



Think in Terms of Equity

- The result of any individual hand does not matter in the long run.
- You will win a fair coin flip 50% of the time.
- You will play many poker hands throughout your career, so the average is all that matters.



- EV = %win(amount you win) + %lose(amount you lose)

- You know you will win 30% of the time.
- If you lose, you lose \$100.
- If you win, you win \$300 (your opponent's bet plus the pot).
- EV = .3(3,100) + .7(-\$100) = \$20



You get all-in before the flop with A-Ko vs J-10s.

• If the total pot is 10,000 chips, how much of it do you own?



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- .5948 X 10,000 = 5,948



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- If J-10s put in 4,500, how much does he lose?



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Pot Odds



Consider Your Pot Odds

- When facing a bet, you have to risk some amount to win some other amount.
- If you will win more often than your pot odds dictate you should, you should continue.
- If you will win less often, you should fold.



Pot odds are traditionally expressed as:

Amount You Win: Amount You Risk

- If your opponent bets 100 into a 100 pot, you have to call 100 to win 200, giving you 200:100 odds, which can be simplified to 2:1.
- To convert odds to the percentage that you need to win, divide the second number by the first number plus the second number.
- Second Number / (Second Number + First Number)
- 100/(100 + 200) = 1/3 = 33%



- If your opponent bets 100 into a 400 pot, you have to call 100 to win 400, giving you 400:100 odds, which can be simplified to 4:1.
- Convert 4:1 to a percentage.

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Second Number / (Second Number + First Number)

• 100/(100 + 400) = 20%



Odds to Percentages

• If your opponent bets 1,500 into a 8,000 pot, you have to call 1,500 to win 9,500, giving you 9,500:1,500 odds, which can be simplified to 6.3:1.

Convert 6.3:1 to a percentage.

Odds to Percentages

• 1,500/(1,500 + 9,500) = 13.6%



Example

- On river your opponent bets 100 into a 100 chip pot.
- You have to call 100 to win a total of 300 (your 100, your opponent's 100 and the 100 pot).
- This means you need to win at least 100/(100+100+100) = 33.3% of the time to continue.
- You figure out how often you will win by comparing your specific hand to your opponent's betting range.



Example

- On the river your opponent bets 150 into a 700 chip pot.
- You have to call 150 to win a total of 1,000 (your 150, your opponent's 150 and the 700 pot).
- This means you need to win at least 150/(150+150+700) = 15% of the time to continue.



Bet Size Matters!

As you face smaller bets, you should continue more often.

As you face larger bets, you should continue less often.



Common Pot Odds

Memorize these common situations

When you are getting	you need to realize at least
4:1	20%
3:1	25%
2:1	33%
1.5:1	40%
1:1	50%



Ranges




What is a Range?

- All possible hands someone could realistically hold at a specific point
- Ranges narrow as additional actions are taken.



Think in Terms of Ranges

- Your opponent's actual hand does not matter!
- You (and your opponents) will play many hands in your range in exactly the same manner.
- You must be balanced to beat strong opponents.





Example - Preflop


- A weak, straightforward player raises from early position using this strategy:
- When he raises, he no longer has any hands that are blue or white because they would be played differently.

Example - Flop

- You call.
- The flop comes Ks-7c-6c.
- Your opponent makes a continuation bet, as you know he would do with his entire range.
- This means his flop betting range is the same as his preflop raising range.





Example - Turn

- You call.
- The turn is the (Ks-7c-6c)-Qd.
- Your opponent checks.
- You know he will mostly check when he does not have a strong hand or perhaps a draw.
- He now only has hands in green and gray.

Example - Turn

 Knowing that, if he will call the hands in green and fold the hands in gray, you should bet because he will frequently fold.

• He will fold 36.4/(18.2 + 36.4) = 67%

- 13.8/33.5 = 41.2%







- 22.8/51.5 = 44.3%






- Figure out which hands have more than 46% equity against your opponent's all-in range.
- As your opponent's range becomes wider or your pot odds become better, you should call with a wider range.
- Experiment with different equities and different hand ranges!



Counting Combinations



There are 16 combinations of each unpaired hand, 4 suited and 12 unsuited.





• On Ah-6c-4d, there are only 12 combinations of A-K available because the Ace of Hearts is on the board.



- 3 Aces X 4 Kings = 12 total combinations
- Only 3 suited combinations remain



Example: On Ah-6c-4d, how many combos of 7-5 (open-ended straight draw) exist?



- Board does not contain 7 or 5. Therefore 4 X 4 = 16 combinations of 7-5
- If opponent only plays suited combos, only 4 realistic combos exist



Example: On Ah-6c-4d, how many combinations of A-6 (two pair) exist?



- Remove ALL Ah / 6c combos
 - 3 X 3 = 9 combinations of A-6
- If opponent only played suited combos, only 2 exist



There are 6 combinations of each pair.



If one of the cards is not available, there are 3 combinations.



If two of the cards are not available, there is 1 combination.





Example: On 9d-6d-3d, how many combinations of sets exist?



• 3 flop cards X 3 combos = 9 total combos

Example: On 9d-9h-6d, how many combos of sets or quads exist?



• 1 combination of 9-9 + 3 combos of 3-3 = 4 total combos of sets or better.



Blockers

- Are relevant cards that make it more difficult for your opponent to have a strong hand.
- If you have the Ace of spades in your hand and there are three spades on the board, you know your opponent cannot have the nut flush.
- Having the Ace of spades makes is less likely your opponent has a flush.

Implementable Strategies



The Game Theory Optimal is Mixed

- I teach a strategy that you can learn and implement at the poker table.
- This is different than other poker courses because they show you the GTO strategy and tell you to memorize it.
- It is impossible to memorize every situation, or even a subset of every situation.
- To succeed, you have to learn a strategy that you can apply.


Chips Change Value

- As players go broke

Previous Example

- You raise to 2.2bbs out of your 25bb effective stack from the button and the big blind goes all-in with this range:
- What are your pot odds?
- You have to call 22.8bbs more into a pot that will be 51.5bbs.
- You need to win at least 22.8/51.5 = 44.3% of the time to call.
- So, call with all hands that have roughly 46% equity or more.





Risk Premium

- In the same example on the bubble of a tournament, you may need closer to 53% equity to justify calling.
- If there are numerous 1bb stacks, you may need 75% equity, and even then, it is close.

When You Can Apply Pressure

- As the large stack
- As the medium stack
- As the short stack
- Pay attention to when you or one of your opponents are under extreme payout pressure you adjust accordingly.

Stack Sizes

- Learn to play all stack sizes well!
- Common stack sizes will be explained.
- You are always playing the effective stack.
- Hand values change as stack sizes change.



Deep Stacked Quick Tips

- Hands with large implied odds (hands that can make nut hands by the river) such as suited Aces and suited connectors go up in value.
- Unsuited big cards and unimproved pocket pairs are difficult to play.
- Top pair is marginal if a lot of money goes into the pot.



Shallow Stacked Quick Tips

- Pairs and big cards become powerful.
- Pushing all-in over an initial raise is difficult to exploit.
- Top pair (or even middle pair) is often good enough to get all-in on the flop.



Preflop Bet Sizing



- When very deep, pot sized raises are ideal.
- Pot sized raise = 3 x last bet + any additional money in the pot
- Raise one "unit" larger from out of position.



- Pot sized raise = 3 x last bet + any additional money in the pot
- How much is a pot sized raise when you are facing 3 limpers?



- Pot sized raise = 3 x last bet + any additional money in the pot

- If a raise would put in more than 30% of your stack, go all-in instead.
- Add 1 additional "unit" for each caller.
- From out of position 30bbs deep facing a 2.5bb raise and a caller, 3-bet to 3.2(2.5) + 2.5 = 10.5, so go all-in if you want to 3-bet.

- With 10x an initial raise or less, going all-in is a reasonable option.
- With more than 10x though, 3-betting to a non-all-in size is ideal.



Exploitative Preflop Bet Sizing

- Against strong players, use the same sizing in similar situations.
- Against bad opponents, you should adjust to maximally exploit them.
- Raise larger with your best hands against calling stations.
- Raise larger with your bluffs against habitual folders.


- Comprised of the best hands that do not mind getting 4-bet (re-re-raised) as well as hands that are not quite good enough to call

Polarized Range

- Comprised of the best hands that do not mind getting 4-bet (re-re-raised) as well as hands that are not quite good enough to call
- Ideal to 3-bet with when your opponent will tend to 4-bet or fold
- Powerful because they keep your opponent guessing





Condensed Range

- Comprised of hands that are not premium, but are also not weak
- You will usually have a condensed range when someone raises and you just call, or when you raise, someone 3-bets, and you call.
- Callers are usually condensed.

Capped vs. Uncapped Range

- The player with fewer nut hands is said to be capped.
- The player with more nut hands is said to be uncapped.

- You raise UTG and the big blind calls.
- UTG is uncapped and BB is capped.



Position Matters



Position Matters

- Position gives you information and control.
- You get to play wider ranges from in position.
- From the blinds, you act last before the flop, but you then have the worst position postflop.




- If your opponents play too tightly or rarely 3-bet, raise wider.





What is the opponent's strategy?

- Against a straightforward opponent, fold a decent portion of your range.
- Against a maniac, defend with a decently large portion of your range.



Adjust!

- You raise from LJ to 2.75bbs with A-Jo and the button 3-bets to 9bbs out of his 75bb effective stack.
- Against a tight player, always fold.
- Against a maniac, always call (or perhaps 4-bet).
- Call with small and medium pocket pairs.
- Call with suited connectors against a maniac but fold against a tight player.



- When facing any raise, figure out how much you have to risk compared to how much you can potentially win on the later betting rounds.
- If someone raises to 2.5bbs out of a 75bb effective stack, you are calling 2.5bbs to potentially win a pot of 7.5bbs plus 72.5bbs remaining in the stacks.
- IO = (Amount Remaining in Stacks + Pot) / Call Amount



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- IO = (Amount Remaining in Stacks + Pot) / Call Amount
- (72.5 + 7.5)/2.5 =



- When facing any raise, figure out how much you have to risk compared to how much you can potentially win on the later betting rounds.
- If someone raises to 2.5bbs out of a 75bb effective stack, you are calling 2.5bbs to potentially win a pot of 7.5bbs plus 72.5bbs remaining in the stacks.
- IO = (Amount Remaining in Stacks + Pot) / Call Amount
- (72.5 + 7.5)/2.5 = 34

- You will not fully realize your implied odds!
- You want to get at least:
- 10:1 implied odds with small pairs
- 20:1 implied odds with suited connectors
- 20:1 implied odds with suited Aces
- If you are not getting the correct implied odds, consider if your hand can continue based on its own merit.
- 8-8 can call 3-bet even when you are not getting 10:1 because it will occasionally flop an overpair.

Reverse Implied Odds

- Hands that tend to be dominated have reverse implied odds.
- These hands should frequently be folded to a 3-bet, or used as 4-bet bluffs.
- As stacks get shorter, hands with reverse implied odds become more playable (and hands with implied odds become less playable).





Definition: Mathematical % that you must defend to keep your opponent from blindly profiting from pure aggression.

- AKA: How to prevent from getting "run over" by bluffs
- MDF = 1 opponent's bet/(opponent's bet + pot)
 - Be sure to account for the blinds and antes!

• MDF is how often you should defend at the least.






Not in Range

- Strive to over-defend.
- Every continuing hand needs realize at least equity equal to your pot odds.
 - Dominated hands under-realize their equity.
 - When you are out of position, you will under-realize your equity.

- If opponent were bluffing with any two cards, this bet would have to force a fold at least **68**% of the time to make a profit.

 You have to call more often than 32% to prevent opponent from exploitatively over-bluffing.





MDF Adjustments

Adjusting to Player Types:

- As your opponent's range is tighter, you should defend tighter.
- As your opponent's range is wider, you should defend wider.

Adjusting to Number of Players:

• MDF is "divided" by all players remaining in the pot.



Facing Limpers



Facing One Limper 75bbs Deep

- There are two types of limpers:
- Tricky Limps with some amount of premium hands to trap.
- Straightforward Limps hands that are thought to be not good enough to raise.



Facing One Tricky Limper 75bbs Deep

- They may limp with only premium hands
 ...or mostly marginal hands plus a few premium hands.
- Most will limp/3-bet with only the best hands.
- Most are only capable of being in tricky from early position.



Facing One Tricky Limper 75bbs Deep

- Limp behind and see a flop with hands that flop well.
- Raise or fold with hands that do not flop well.
- When you get limp/3-bet, fold unless you are getting the correct implied odds.
- Raising for value with the intention of folding if 3-bet is fine if their range contains many marginal hands.



Facing One Straightforward Limper 75bbs Deep

- They usually have junky ranges that do not contain the best hands.
- Raise them with a range similar to your initial preflop raising range.
- You may be able to raise even wider against some players.



Facing One Straightforward Limper 75bbs Deep

- Raise a strong linear range of strong pairs, middle pairs, and big cards that do not mind being heads-up.
- It is fine to limp behind with hands that flop well, like small pairs, weak suited Aces, suited connectors, suited gappers, decent offsuit connectors.
- When you get limp/3-bet, get out of the way unless they are maniacs.



Facing Multiple Limpers 75bbs Deep

- Is the first limper tricky or straightforward?
- Play a bit tighter than you normally would, unless all the limpers are likely weak.
- Raising to large amounts may be justified.
- Bluffing is still viable if you expect to have a lot of fold equity.



When Your Limp Gets Raised 75bbs Deep

- What are your pot odds/implied odds?
- If the opponent makes a large raise, fold hands that flop poorly.
- If your opponent makes a small raise, call with hands that flop well.

- How likely are you to get 3-bet if you call?




Facing an Early Position Raise 75bbs Deep

- Tend to assume early position raisers have decently strong ranges.
- Bluff a bit less often than the charts recommend.
- If you 3-bet and they 4-bet, assume they have an effective nut hand.
- If your opponent often limps, their raises may be quite strong.




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Facing a Late Position Raise 75bbs Deep

- Many players will raise far too many hands from late position and then defend poorly.

Playing from the Small Blind 75bbs Deep

Playing three-ways with the worst relative position is difficult and should be avoided

When to 3-Bet More Often:

- When the big blind plays well
- When the initial raiser plays in a timid manner
- Against wide ranges
- Winning the pot immediately or getting heads-up and reducing the depth is highly beneficial.




Playing from the Big Blind 75bbs Deep

- Aim to see lots of flops, especially against wide ranges.
- Defend wider as the raise size gets smaller.
- Defend much tighter against abnormally large raises.

Consider Your Opponent's Tendencies

- Strategy will adjust upon player type of RFI
 - Tight, Aggressive (TAG)
 - Tight, Passive (Nit)
 - Loose, Aggressive (LAG)
 - Loose, Passive (Calling Station)
- The caller will usually be capped.



Against Tight Ranges

RFI TAG:

- Play fundamentally sound poker.
- Basically follow the 75bb charts.
 - Fold, call, and 3-bet for value and as a bluff with normal balanced frequencies

RFI Nit:

- Fold unsuited big cards that are often dominated. K♦ J♣
- Call more implied odds hands.
 10♦9♦
- 3-bet bluff much less often. A♦ J♣



Against Loose Ranges

RFI LAG:

- Fold less often (expand your overall range).
- Call more unsuited big cards that are ahead.
- 3-bet bluff more (polarized).

- Q# 8#
- K**♦**J♣
- A♦10♣


RFI Calling Station:

- Fold less often (expand your overall range). Q 8 •
- 3-bet unsuited big cards that are often ahead. K♦ J♣
- 3-bet for value *more* (linear). A♦ 10♦

Use a decently large (pot sized) bet for all raises!



Putting It All Together





From the Big Blind 75bbs Deep

- Getting good "price" and "closing action" are not great reasons to defend your big blind multi-way.
 - You will realize your equity poorly.
 - Postflop playability is highly important.
 - Do not play junky offsuit cards.
 - Avoid playing hands that make mostly marginal made hands.

How To Continue from the big blind:

- Proceed as if you were on the button (even though its cheaper).
 - Call with implied odds hands and suited big cards.
 10♣ 8♣
 - 3-bet bluff unsuited big cards.

 - 3-bet for value with your best hands.

Proceed Cautiously:

- What are the ranges at play?
 - 3-bettor is the most important range to consider

Factors that Increase Your Ability to Call:

- More players vs. fewer players seeing the flop
- Closing the action vs. not closing (how likely are you to get back 4-bet?)
- Better pot odds vs. worse pot odds

Proceed Even More Cautiously:

- You should have no calling range < 75bb.
- You are going to get 4-bet often enough to kill your implied odds.
 - You can't profitably call with most pairs and suited connectors anymore

Play Exceptionally Tight:

- What hands are we profitably getting it in for 75bb against > 2 players?
 - 3-bet from EP: Usually only QQ+
 - 3-bet from LP: Usually only JJ+
 - You should not have a 4-bet bluffing range.

Adjustments to Getting 4-Bet

- Against more aggressive opponents, you must defend wider.
- If your range is polarized, continue with the top of your range.
 - Big pairs (10-10) and suited big cards(K-Qs) are good candidates.
- If your range is linear, fold your worst offsuit hands.
 - You should usually still fold A-Qo, K-Jo, etc.

Recurring Concepts As Stacks Decrease

Stack-To-Pot Ratio (SPR):

 Compares smallest stack size in play to the size of the pot to help evaluate strategy & risk.

SPR 0 - 3 = Low

SPR 3 - 6 = Medium

SPR 6+ = High

- SPR informs which starting hands you play with, and how you play them.
- 35bb 60bb you enter the "Medium" SPR category.
 - You must understand how lower SPRs impact your strategy.



Recurring Concepts As Stacks Decrease

Generally, your standards for going All-in decrease SPR decreases.

- You are not risking as much, so you get to be wrong more often.
- Example: All-in with top pair, top kicker at 25bb vs.100bb.

How Lower SPR Changes the Way You Play:

- Starting Hands:
 - Implied odds hands Decrease in value. 7 4 6 4
 - Strong big cards *Increase* in value.

 A♦ J♣
- Strategy:
 - OOP you are incentivized to go All-in more often.
 - This reduces your positional disadvantage.


What is the opponent's strategy?



Implied Odds

- As your stack decreases, your implied odds will decrease.
- If someone raises to 2.5bbs out of a 45bb effective stack, you are calling 2.5bbs to potentially win a pot of 7.5bbs plus 42.5bbs remaining in the stacks.
- (42.5 + 7.5)/2.5 = 22



Implied Odds

- You want to get at least:
- 10:1 implied odds with small pairs
- 20:1 implied odds with suited connectors
- 20:1 implied odds with suited Aces
- If you are not getting the correct implied odds, consider if your hand can continue based on its own merit even if it does not improve.
- As stacks get shorter, you will often not be getting the correct implied odds, forcing you to go all-in or fold many speculative hands, depending on your opponent's tendencies.


• If you raise to 2.5bbs and someone 3-bets to 8bbs out of a 45bb effective stack, you are calling 5.5bbs to potentially win a pot of 18.5bbs plus 37bbs remaining in the stacks.

• (37 + 18.5)/5.5 = 10





Facing Limpers



Facing One Limper 40bbs Deep

- The same logic applies as when you are deeper stacked.
- What is the limper's range?
- Many players will stop limping as stacks get shallower.
- Remember, there are tricky and straightforward limpers.
- Avoid raising where you will have to fold decently strong hands to a 3-bet or all-in.



Facing Multiple Limpers 40bbs Deep

- Is the first limper tricky or straightforward?
- Play a bit tighter than you normally would, unless all the limpers are likely weak.
- Raising to large amounts may be justified.
- Bluffing is still viable if you expect to have a lot of fold equity.



When Your Limp Gets Raised 40bbs Deep

- What are your pot odds/implied odds?
- If the opponent makes a large raise, fold hands that flop poorly.
- If your opponent makes a small raise, call with hands that flop well.
- Consider protecting your limping range against frequent raisers.

Facing a Preflop Raise 40bbs Deep

- What is your opponent's raising range?
- How likely are you to get 3-bet if you call?
- How many players are likely to see the flop?
- How will your opponent respond to aggression?



Facing an Early Position Raise 40bbs Deep

- Tend to assume early position raisers have decently strong ranges.
- Bluff a bit less often than the charts recommend.
- If you 3-bet and they 4-bet, assume they have an effective nut hand.
- If your opponent often limps, their raises may be quite strong.





- You can start to get out of line, especially against late position raisers.
- Many players will raise far too many hands from late position and then defend poorly.

Playing from the Small Blind 40bbs Deep

Pretty much the same as playing 75bbs deep:

 Playing three-ways with the worst relative position is difficult and should be avoided.

When to 3-bet More Often:

- When the big blind plays well.
- When the initial raiser plays in a timid manner.
- Against wide ranges.
- Winning the pot immediately or getting heads-up and reducing the depth is highly beneficial.



Playing from the Big Blind 75bbs Deep

Pretty much the same as playing 75bbs deep:

- Aim to see lots of flops, especially against wide ranges.
- Defend wider as the raise size gets smaller.
- Defend much tighter against abnormally large raises.



Against Tight Ranges

Remember: The caller will usually be capped.

RFI TAG:

- Play fundamentally sound poker.
- Follow the 40bb charts.
 - Fold, call, and 3-bet for value/as a bluff with normal, balanced ranges.

RFI Nit:

- Fold unsuited big cards that are often dominated. K♦ J♣
- Call more implied odds hands.
- 3-bet bluff much less often.

RFI LAG:

- Fold less often (expand your overall range).



Putting It All Together





From the Big Blind 40bbs Deep

- Getting good "price" and "closing action" are not great reasons to defend your big blind multi-way.
 - You will realize your equity poorly.
 - Postflop playability is highly important.
 - Do not play junky offsuit cards.
 - Avoid playing hands that make mostly marginal made hands.

Example 1: Against a raise and call, hands like K-60, Q-70 and J-50 should be folded.

Example 2: A-xo, K-xs and Q-xs should be folded against tight raisers or a larger number of opponents.



When You Call and Get 3-bet



When You Call and Get 3-bet 40bbs Deep

Proceed Cautiously:

- What are the ranges at play?
 - 3-bettor is the most important range to consider

Factors that Increase Your Ability to Call:

- More players vs. fewer players seeing the flop
- Closing the action vs. not closing (how likely are you to get back 4-bet?)
- Better pot odds vs. worse pot odds

Facing a Preflop Raise and 3-bet 40bbs Deep

Proceed Even More Cautiously:

- You should have no calling range < 75bb.
- You are going to get 4-bet often enough to kill your implied odds.
 - · You can't profitably call with most pairs and suited connectors.

Play Exceptionally Tight:

- What hands can you profitably get in for 40bb against > 2 players?
 - 3-bet from EP: Usually only Q-Q+
 - 3-bet from LP: Usually only 10-10+, A-K+
 - You should not have a 4-bet bluffing range.



Facing a Preflop 4-bet



3-betting and then Getting 4-bet 40bbs Deep

You will often be facing an all-in!

Proceed Even More Cautiously:

Defending against 4-bets too often is a huge leak.

Continuing Range Against Two Players:

- What hands can you profitably get in for 40bb against > 2 players?
 - Usually only Q-Q+ and A-Ks

Example:

HJ raises to 2.5bbs, you 3-bet A-Qo to 7.5bbs from the button,
 HJ 4-bets all-in = ???



Adjustments to Getting 4-bet

- Against more aggressive opponents, you can call off a bit wider.
- If your range is polarized, continue with the top of your range.
- If your range is linear, fold your worst offsuit hands.



Stack-To-Pot Ratio (SPR):

Your SPR will continue to decrease.



• 22bb – 35bb you enter the "Low" SPR category.



Recurring Concepts As Stacks Decrease

Your standards for going All-in decrease SPR decreases.

You are not risking as much, so you get to be wrong more often.

How Lower SPR Changes the Way You Play:

- Starting Hands:
 - Implied odds hands Decrease in value. 7♣ 6♣
 - Strong big cards *Increase* in value.

 A♦ J♣
- Strategy:
 - OOP you are incentivized to go All-in more often.
 - This reduces your positional disadvantage.




Recurring Concepts As Stacks Decrease

How to play 22bb - 35bb Deep:

- Follow the GTO charts unless it becomes clear your opponents make significant mistakes.
- Raise with a wider range if your opponents rarely 3-bet.
- Most deep stacked concepts will no longer apply with 35bbs to 60bbs.







Implied Odds

- If someone raises to 2bbs out of a 25bb effective stack, you are calling 2bbs to potentially win a pot of 6.5bbs plus 23bbs remaining in the stacks.
- (23 + 6.5)/2 = 14.75
- If you raise to 2bbs and someone 3-bets to 5.5bbs out of a 25bb effective stack, you are calling 3.5bbs to potentially win a pot of 13.5bbs plus 19.5bbs remaining in the stacks.
- (19.5 + 13.5)/3.5 = 9.4



Implied Odds

- You want to get at least:
- 10:1 implied odds with small pairs
- 20:1 implied odds with suited connectors
- 20:1 implied odds with suited Aces
- You will almost never be getting the right pot odds to call with the intention of only continuing if you flop a strong hand.
- Calling is often only best with decently strong hands that flop amazingly well and premium slow plays (especially when out of position).







Facing an All-in

- What are your pot odds?
- Which hands are getting the proper odds to call?
- How much of an edge do you want?
- Realize that you will experience variance!



Facing Limpers



Facing One Limper 25bbs Deep

- Many players will no longer have a limping range as stacks get shallower.
- What is the limper's strategy?
- Be careful raising limpers because you can easily find yourself committing too many chips when you raise preflop and then make a flop continuation bet.
- Avoid raising where you will have to fold decently strong hands to an all-in.



Facing Multiple Limpers 25bbs Deep

- Is the first limper tricky or straightforward?
- Play a bit tighter than you normally would, unless all the limpers are likely weak.
- Bluffing is still viable if you expect to have a lot of fold equity.
- As there are more limpers and your stack decreases, going all-in could be ideal.
- If six weak players limp before you, going all-in with A-10 for 25bbs is the only logical play.



When Your Limp Gets Raised 25bbs Deep

- What are your pot odds/implied odds?
- If the opponent makes a large raise, fold hands that flop poorly.
- If your opponent makes a small raise, call with hands that flop well.
- Consider protecting your limping range against frequent raisers.

Facing a Preflop Raise 25bbs Deep

- What is your opponent's raising range?
- How likely are you to get 3-bet if you call?
- How many players are likely to see the flop?
- How will your opponent respond to aggression?




Facing an Early Position Raise 25bbs Deep

- Tend to assume early position raisers have decently strong ranges.
- Most players do not get out of line from early position.
- 3-betting all-in becomes optimal with some strong, but non-nut hands.
- If you 3-bet and they 4-bet all-in, assume they have an effective nut hand unless they will 4-bet with any hand they think is "reasonable" like 8-8 and A-Js.





- You can start to get out of line, especially against late position raisers.
- Many players will raise far too many hands from late position and then defend poorly.



Exploitative Preflop Jamming



Consider this situation

Going all-in before the flop is a valid option!



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If you go all-in, either...

- You will either win the small pot when everyone folds.
- You will get called and get all-in slightly behind with some dead money in the pot.
- The value of this play can be determined using math.



Preflop Fold Equity Equation

- Profit =
- Percent opponents fold X pot you win +
 Percent opponent1 calls X (equity in the pot X total pot when you get called amount you put in the pot) +
 Percent opponent2 calls X (equity in the pot X total pot when you get called amount you put in the pot)
- Let's fill in the blanks!
- How often do the opponents fold?
- You need to know each player's preflop range at this point as well as the range they will call your all-in.



Initial Raiser's Expected Strategy

- The initial raiser is probably using roughly this strategy:
- He will call your all-in 33% and fold 67%.

- Profit =
- .32 X pot you win +
 .33 X (equity in the pot X total pot when you get called amount you put in the pot) +
 .35 X (equity in the pot X total pot when you get called amount you put in the pot)
- Use Equilab to figure out your equity against each opponent's calling range.

Plug in the other numbers

- Profit =
- .32 X pot you win +
 .33 X (.33(total amount in pot when you get called) amount you put in the pot) +
 .35 X (.39(total amount in pot when you get called) amount you put in the pot)
- When you win the pot preflop, you win 26,000 chips (preflop raise, call, small blind, big blind, ante)
- When you get called, the total pot will be:
- 88,000 + 88,000 + any additional money in the pot
- 88,000 + 88,000 + 8,000 + 2,000 + 4,000 = 190,000
- You put 84,000 more into the pot.
- Your 4,000 big blind does not count.



Solve it!

• Profit = $.32 \times 26,000 + .33 \times (.33(190,000) - 84,000) + .35 \times (.39(190,000) - 84,000)$

• Profit = 8,320 - 7,029 - 3,465 = -2,174

• However, if the opponents fold just a little more often, this situation quickly becomes profitable.



What happens if the caller never calls?

- Profit = $.67 \times 26,000 + .33 \times (.33(190,000) 84,000)$
- Profit = 17,420 7,029 = 10,391
- This is a HUGE amount of profit!
- Worse preflop hands will often still have 29% equity or so against a reasonable call off range.



Against Only One Opponent

Let's assume the opponent calls your all-in 50% of the time.



- This is a nice amount of profit that cannot be turned down.






Against a Wide Range

Let's assume the same range but now it under-defends.

- Profit = $.83 \times 18,000 + .17 \times (.35(182,000) 84,000)$
- Profit = 14,940 3,451 = 11,489
- This is a HUGE amount of profit.





Main Points

- Do not shove wide over tight ranges.
- Shove wide over loose ranges.
- Target late position raisers, especially if you have a tight image.
- In multi-way pots, sometimes the callers will rarely call off, adding dead money to the pot.
- Jam tighter from earlier positions because you have to worry about players yet to act waking up with a hand.

Against Tight Ranges

Remember: The caller will usually be capped.

RFI TAG:

Play fundamentally sound poker.

RFI Nit:

- Fold unsuited big cards that are often dominated. K♦ J♣
- Call more implied odds hands.
 10♦9♦
- 3-bet bluff much less often. A♦ J♣



Against Loose Ranges

RFI LAG:

- Fold less often (expand your overall range).
- Call more unsuited big cards that are ahead.
- Go all-in with high equity hands

- Q# 8#
- K**♦**J♣
- A♦10♣


RFI Calling Station:

- Fold less often (expand your overall range).
- Go all-in with big cards that are often ahead.

 K♦ J♣
- Go all-in for value more (linear).



Putting It All Together





From the Big Blind 25bbs Deep

- Getting good "price" and "closing action" are not great reasons to defend your big blind multi-way.
 - You will realize your equity poorly.
 - Postflop playability is highly important.
 - Do not play junky offsuit cards.
 - Avoid playing hands that make mostly marginal made hands.
- Jamming all-in with hands with equity or an Ace blocker is a powerful strategy.

Example 1: Against a raise and call, hands like K-60, Q-70 and J-50 should be folded.

Example 2: A-xo, K-xs and Q-xs should be folded against tight raisers or a larger number of opponents.



When You Call and Get 3-bet



When You Call and Get 3-bet 25bbs Deep

Proceed Cautiously:

- What are the ranges at play?
 - 3-bettor is the most important range to consider

Factors that Increase Your Ability to Call:

- More players vs. fewer players seeing the flop
- Closing the action vs. not closing (how likely are you to get back 4-bet?)
- Better pot odds vs. worse pot odds

Make sure to protect your calling range!



Facing a Preflop Raise and 3-bet



Facing a Preflop Raise and 3-bet 25bbs Deep

Proceed Even More Cautiously:

- You should have no calling range < 75bb.
- You are going to get 4-bet often enough to kill your implied odds.
 - You can't profitably call with most pairs and suited connectors.

Play Exceptionally Tight:

- What hands can you profitably get in for 25bb against > 2 players?
 - 3-bet from EP: Usually only 10-10+, A-K
 - 3-bet from LP: Usually only 8-8+, A-Q+, A-Js+
 - You should not have a 4-bet bluffing range.



- Profit =
- Percent opponents fold X pot you win +
 Percent opponent1 calls X (equity in the pot X total pot when you get called amount you put in the pot) +
 Percent opponent2 calls X (equity in the pot X total pot when you get called amount you put in the pot)
- The initial raiser will rarely call because he has to worry about you and the 3-bettor.
- If you have no fold equity, the first part of the equation will be 0, forcing you to have a lot of equity.



- The cutoff raises to 2bbs and the button 3-bets to 5.5bbs.
- Which hands are profitable to go all-in with from the small blind?
- Set profit to 0 to find the breakeven all-in range.
- The cutoff will use the top strategy.
- The button will use the bottom strategy.
- This ignores when they both call.



- $0 = .232 \times 10 + .185 \times (equity in the pot \times 57.5 24.5) + .583 \times (equity in the pot \times 54.5 24.5)$
- I used an online algebra calculator.
- Equity in the pot = .388, so you need 38.8% to break even.
- Let's suppose you want to have 41% equity instead to ensure you have an edge.
- Profit = .232 X 10 + .185 X (.41 X 57.5 24.5) + .583 X (.41 X 54.5 24.5)
- This results in you winning .89bbs, which may or may not be worth it, depending on the field's strength.
- With 43% equity though, you win 1.7bbs, which is huge!



- Use Equilab to see which hands have 42% equity in the most common situation, which is when you go all-in and the 3-bettor calls.
- Against J-J+ and A-Ks, only A-A and K-K can profitably shove.
- If you were fine with 39%, you can add Q-Q and A-Ks.
- Tinker with the equation to assume your opponents use different strategies, such as:
 - Folding to your all-in too often
 - Calling too wide
 - Raising/3-betting with only effective nut hands



Facing a Preflop 4-bet



3-betting and then Facing an All-in 25bbs Deep

- When you 3-bet and get jammed on, unless you are playing a maniacal style, assume the 4-bettor has a decently strong hand.
- Your decision is purely based on math depending on your pot odds and how your hand compares to your opponent's all-in range.
- If you use a polarized strategy (as you often should when shallow), your decision will be easy.



3-betting and then Facing an All-in 25bbs Deep

- Lojack raises to 2bbs out of 25bbs, you 3-bet A-Qs to 5.5bbs from the button, lojack goes all-in.
- You have to call 19.5bbs more to win a total of 52.5bbs.
- 19.5/52.5 = 37%
- If you want to have a bit of an edge, call when you have 39% equity.
- You can only fold if you think your opponent is going all-in tighter than 9-9+ and A-Q+.
- · Most players will use this range or wider, allowing you to easily call.



3-betting and then Getting 4-bet 25bbs Deep

- Keep the minimum defense frequency in mind!
- If you fold too often, your opponents can crush you by jamming with a wide range.
- 3-betting small with a wide range against players who only 4-bet all-in with the absolute best hands is a strong exploitative play.
- Some players may only min-raise preflop with hands they plan on getting all-in, meaning you may have little/no fold equity with a 3-bet.
- Pay attention and adjust accordingly!





Recurring Concepts As Stacks Decrease

Stack-To-Pot Ratio (SPR):

Your SPR will continue to decrease.



• 12bb – 22bb you enter the "Low" SPR category.



Recurring Concepts As Stacks Decrease

Your standards for going All-in decrease SPR decreases.

You are not risking as much, so you get to be wrong more often.

How Lower SPR Changes the Way You Play:

- Starting Hands:
 - Implied odds hands Decrease in value. 7♣ 6♣
 - Strong big cards *Increase* in value.


Recurring Concepts As Stacks Decrease

How to play 12BB - 22bb Deep:

- Follow the GTO charts unless it becomes clear your opponents make significant mistakes.
- Raise with a wider range if your opponents rarely 3-bet.





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
Small Blind Play 15bbs Deep

- Your strategy from the small blind depends entirely on the big blind's response.
- If he will frequently fold, raise with any two cards.
- Minimum Defense Frequency = 1 bet/(bet + pot)
- If you raise to 3.5bbs, MDF = 1 3/(3 + 1.5) = 33%
- This means the big blind has to defend with at least 33% of hands, assuming your range has 0% equity (which is never the case).

The SB now uses a limp or all-in strategy!







When Your Raise Gets 3-bet



Decision Time!

- After you raise with a 22bb or shorter stack, most players will either fold, call, or go all-in.
- You will rarely face a small 3-bet.
- Facing an all-in, you have a simple math problem.
- The following charts assume you are fine breaking even.
- Call a bit tighter if you want to have an edge!



Adjust!

- If the opponent is tight and straightforward, fold a decent portion of your range.
- If the opponent is maniacal, defend with a decently large portion of your range.
- Your late position raises will face more resistance.
- Consider your pot odds and postflop playability.







Facing Limpers



Facing One Limper 15bbs Deep

- Many players will no longer have a limping range as stacks get shallower, although some may limp from the button and small blind.
- What is the limper's strategy?
- Avoid raising in spots where you will have to fold decently strong hands to an all-in.
- It is usually best to go all-in over limps, but some weak players may limp and then frequently fold to a 3.5bb raise.



Facing Multiple Limpers 15bbs Deep

- Is the first limper tricky or straightforward?
- Bluffing is still viable, especially when you have a hand that has decent
 equity when called or a blocker and you expect to have a lot of fold equity.



When Your Limp Gets Raised 15bbs Deep

- What are your pot odds/implied odds?
- You will usually have to fold.
- So, make sure your limping range is protected against frequent raisers.

- What is your opponent's raising range?
- How likely are you to get 3-bet if you call?
- How many players are likely to see the flop?
- How will your opponent respond to aggression?




Facing an Early Position Raise 15bbs Deep

- Tend to assume early position raisers have decently strong ranges.
- Most players do not get out of line from early position.
- You will usually have no calling range from early and middle position.





Against Loose Ranges

- Since a 3-bet would put in more than 30% of your stack, you should go all-in.
- You can still have a calling range, especially from the later positions with hands that flop well.
- Big offsuit cards usually prefer to go all-in or fold.



Against Tight Ranges

Remember: The caller will usually be capped.

RFI TAG:

Play fundamentally sound poker.

RFI Nit:

- Fold unsuited big cards that are often dominated.
- Call more implied odds hands.
- 3-bet bluff much less often.



Against Loose Ranges

RFI LAG:


- Fold less often (expand your overall range).
- 3-bet all-in more often, especially with blocker bluffs.

RFI Calling Station:

- Fold less often (expand your overall range).
- 3-bet all-in more often, especially with strong value hands.



Putting It All Together





From the Big Blind 25bbs Deep

- Getting good "price" and "closing action" are not great reasons to defend your big blind multi-way.
 - You will realize your equity poorly.
 - Postflop playability is highly important.
 - Do not play junky offsuit cards.
 - Avoid playing hands that make mostly marginal made hands.
- Jamming all-in with hands with equity or an Ace blocker is a powerful strategy.

Example 1: Against a raise and call, hands like K-60, Q-70 and J-50 should be folded.

Example 2: A-xo, K-xs and Q-xs should be folded against tight raisers or a larger number of opponents.

You will be facing an all-in!

So, you have a math problem.

Make sure to protect your calling range!



Facing a Preflop Raise and 3-bet



Facing a Preflop Raise and 3-bet 15bbs Deep

You will be facing a raise and an all-in.

This is a pure math problem, depending on the ranges at play.

Rule of Thumb:

- Which hands can you profitably get in for 15bb against ~2 typical TAGs?
 - Usually only 10-10+, A-Q+
- Which hands can you profitably get in for 15bb against ~2 nits?
 - Usually only J-J+, A-K
- How about against ~2 LAGs or a button 3-bet?
 - 8-8+, A-10s+

When Folded to in the Small Blind

 Having a limping range with more than 8bbs allows you to play a wider range of hands profitably.

 With fewer than 8bbs, use the Push/Fold app.

Facing an All-in



When there is an All-in Before You

- It is a math problem!
- Which hands have the proper equity to call against your opponent's all-in range?
- The Push/Fold app has calling ranges, but those are best for when your opponent goes all-in optimally, which will rarely be the case.
- Don't forget the players yet to act!



When there is an All-in Before You

- The lojack goes all-in for 10bbs.
- Which hands should you call with from the cutoff?
- Which hands should you call with from the big blind?



When there is an All-in and Call Before You

• It is still a math problem!

Proceed cautiously!!!

UTG+1 goes all-in and the cutoff calls.

Which hands can you call with from the big blind?



Facing a Preflop Raise or a Limp




What is the Raiser's Strategy?

- Many players go all-in or fold, so a min-raise may be suspicious.
- You will not be getting the correct implied odds.
- You should not have much of a calling range besides from the big blind.

When there are Limpers

- What are the limpers' strategies?

- Against weak limpers, go all-in as the Push/Fold app recommends.
